Lions and Cats

The Brisbane Lions will face Geelong this Saturday night at the Gabba with the winner advancing to the 2020 Toyota AFL Grand Final.

The Lions have only beaten Geelong once in their past 10 attempts, with that sole victory coming last year following a spectacular mark and goal from ex-Cat Lincoln McCarthy in the dying stages of the match.


Geelong won the clash between the two sides earlier this year by 27 points at Metricon Stadium.

Preliminary Flashback

Coincidentally, the Brisbane Lions' last Preliminary Final (16 years ago) was also against Geelong.

On that occasion, the **Daniel Bradshaw** booted a gamehigh four goals and **Nigel Lappin** collected 30 disposals to help the Lions prevail at the MCG by 9 points - and set a Grand Final date with Port Adelaide.

It would also prove to be **Shaun Hart's** final AFL game, after he sustained a serious facial injury that forced him to miss the 2004 Grand Final.
