Our Brisbane Lions Academy has seen enormous growth in the last few years in the program structure, in athlete acquisition and especially in the girl's space after the successful introduction of our AFLW team. Whilst the increase in numbers has been a great sign for our program, we will not sit idle and just hope that these numbers will continue to increase.

We want to provide an opportunity for all athletes, football and non-football, in a pathway that provides improvement, focuses on an athlete's weapons and creates opportunity at the highest level an athlete wants to aspire to. Fundamentally, our program will also have a clear focus on assisting local clubs and ensuring that when a player returns from our program, they will be better.

Change is inevitable. Through this period of shut down, there were some circumstances that escalated the review of our Academy program. As a result of the pandemic, AFL Queensland reduced its workforce in the talent space and our internal budgets were reviewed, reduced and re-distributed. An alignment in structures between AFL Queensland & the Academy occurred with more responsibility now given to us to coordinate a bigger program.

With this alignment, a change in roles and responsibilities was been made to the management of the Academy. The Academy Manager position was made redundant, and Luke Curran, a long-time servant of the Academy for over 10 years decided to leave the Brisbane Lions Football Club. I would like to acknowledge his massive contribution to this role and the level he has helped the program reach. Football is an engrossing emotional joy and the amount of sacrifice he & his family have made in those 10 years in growing the Academy has been enormous and we thank them.

With our focus now taking more responsibility of talent development and growth, we have added significant resources to the new direction of the Academy.

You will see some significant changes in our program in the coming months, where our staff will spend more time with players and coaches within our regions, decentralising the initial part of our program. Paul, Zane, Josh and Bill will be more mobile and be actively engaged in supporting our regions.

The change will bring with it more challenges, but also opportunities to grow and get better. This is a very exciting shift and the resources we have put in place have expertise in the areas that will focus on growing our athletes, building relationships and looking for continuous improvement.
