Vale Arthur Wilson

The Brisbane Lions mourned the loss of Club stalwart and Hall of Famer **Arthur Wilson**, who passed away peacefully last December, aged 90.

Wilson made an outstanding contribution to the game of Australian Rules Football – and more specifically, to Fitzroy and the Brisbane Lions, with whom he passionately served for more than 50 years.


Vale Graham Campbell

The Brisbane Lions lost another important Club figure earlier this year, with former player, senior coach, and Life Member, **Graham Campbell**, passing away aged 85.

Campbell has the rare of honour of being part of Fitzroy's Night Premiership as a player in 1959, before helping steer the Club to another Night Premiership in 1978 as coach.

He also claimed a WAFL Premiership as senior coach of West Perth in 1975.

Bates' Big Year

Star Brisbane Lions AFLW midfielder **Emily Bates** became the first player at the club to be awarded the AFL Coaches Association Champion Player of the Year.

Bates polled 74 votes to take out the Coaches Award ahead of Anne Hatchard (Adel) and Ash Riddell (NM).

"From where we stand, she's the epitome of the Brisbane Lions in how she prepares and how she plays," AFLW coach Craig Starcevich said.

50-Game Milestones

The Brisbane Lions celebrated three significant 50-game celebrations in the AFLW recently, with Head Coach **Craig Starcevich** and midfielders **Ally Anderson** and **Emily Bates** notching up the milestone after six seasons.
